Earnings Presentation



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For purposes of the non-financial operating and statistical data included in this presentation, including the aggregation of our non-U.S. dollar denominated investment funds, foreign currencies have been converted to U.S. dollars at the spot rate as of the last trading day of the reporting period when presenting period end balances, and the average rate for the period has been utilized when presenting activity during such period. With respect to capital commitments raised in foreign currencies, the conversion to U.S. dollars is based on the exchange rate as of the date of closing of such capital commitment.



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Quarterly highlights

Financial Results

- Net investment income (NII) per share was \$0.47, equating to an annualized NII yield on book value of 10.7%(1)
- Net income per share was \$0.37, equating to an annualized return on book value of 8.3%⁽¹⁾
- Net asset value per share as of June 30, 2025, was \$17.56, as compared to \$17.64 as of March 31, 2025
- Subsequent to quarter-end, the Company's Board of Directors declared a dividend of \$0.42 per share for the third quarter of 2025 payable to stockholders of record as of September 16, 2025. The Board of Directors previously announced an additional dividend of \$0.03 per share payable to stockholders of record as of September 16, 2025⁽²⁾

Portfolio Highlights

- Gross and net investment fundings were \$529.6 million and \$27.3 million, respectively
- \$2,501.8 million total investment portfolio at fair value consisting predominately of senior secured, floating rate loans
- Highly diversified portfolio invested across 185 portfolio companies operating across 29 different industries
- 11.4% weighted average yield at amortized cost on the investment portfolio(3)(4)
- Investments on non-accrual represented 1.7% and 0.6% of the total investment portfolio at amortized cost and fair value, respectively, as of June 30, 2025

Liquidity and Funding

- Ending net debt-to-equity was 1.20x, as compared to 1.17x as of March 31, 2025⁽⁵⁾
- Diverse financing structures across secured and unsecured debt; unsecured debt represents 61% of total debt outstanding at quarter-end
- Strong liquidity totaling \$796 million, with \$592 million of undrawn capacity on revolving credit facility, \$174 million of cash and cash equivalents, including \$137 million of restricted cash, and \$30 million of unsettled trades

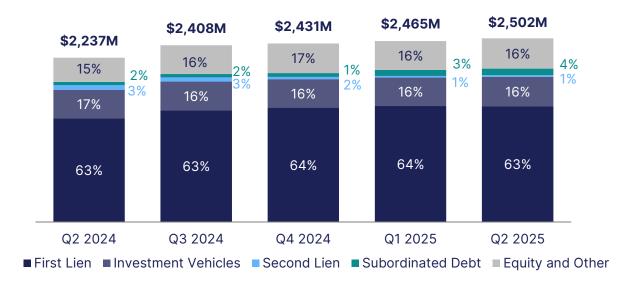

Invested Portfolio by Asset Type (At Fair Value)



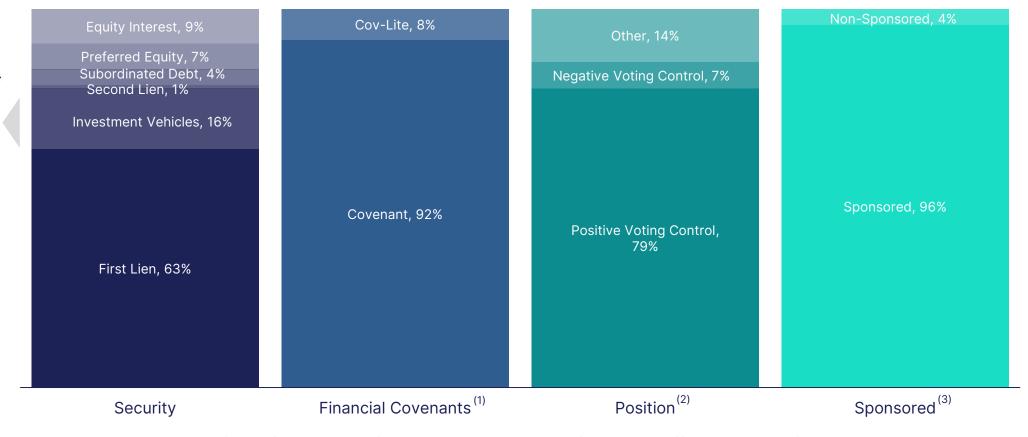


Portfolio highlights - downside management focused

98% of the investments held in Investment Vehicles are First Lien, resulting in a lookthrough first lien exposure of 84%





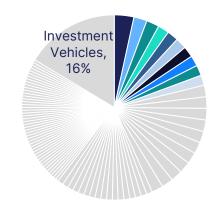

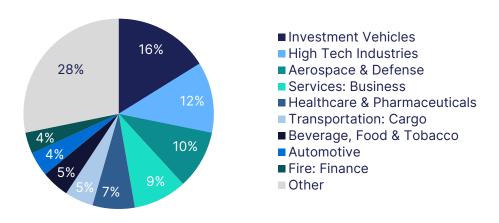

Investment Diversification

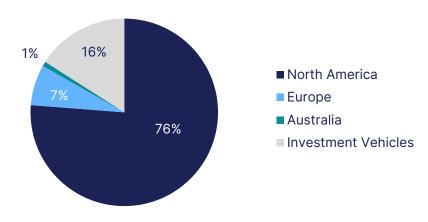


Top 10 companies represent 22% of the portfolio at fair value

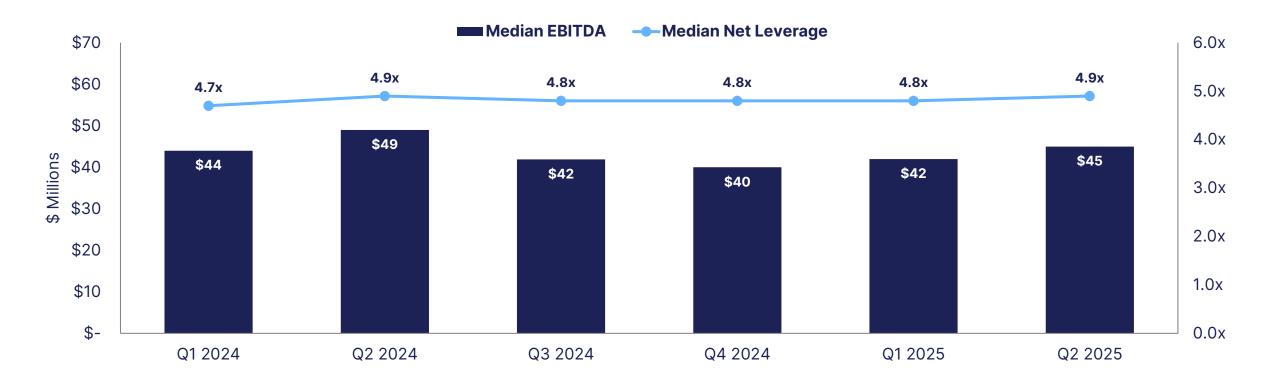

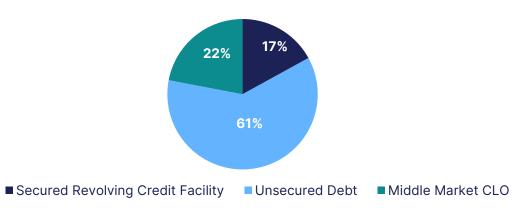

Liability Profile by Debt Outstanding(3)



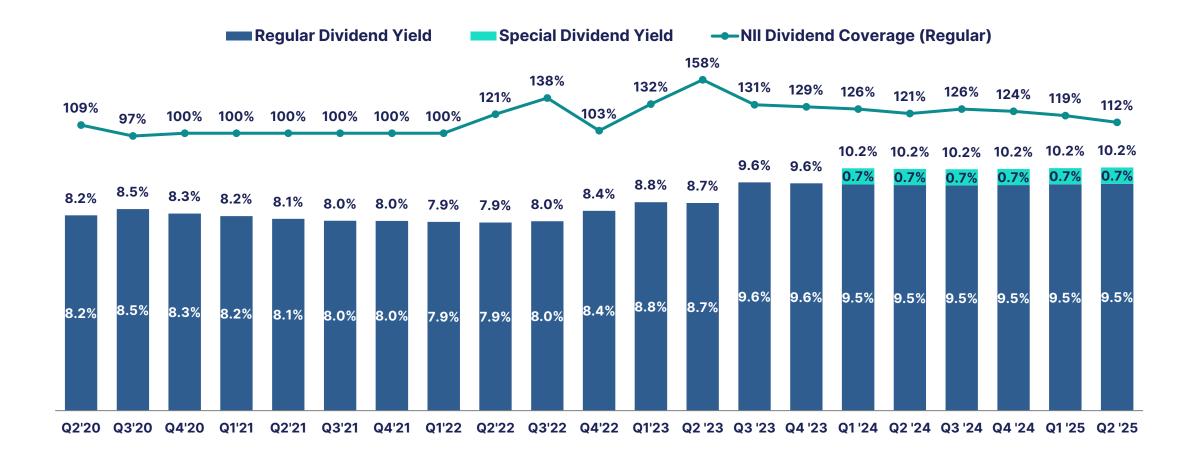
Debt Maturity Schedule by Total Commitments (\$M)(3)
